•	Investment in real estate in Dubai in mid-2006 stood at US\$44.95 billion up from Dh11 billion (US\$3 billion) in 2000.
•	Between 2000 and 2005 the number of residential buildings in Dubai increased by more than 42 per cent, to 79,000 buildings from 56,000.
•	The number of residential units, meanwhile, surged 63 per cent over the five years to about 238,000 at the end of 2005.


#### **FACT**





#### **Green Roofs**

- Cool in the summer and insulated in the winter
- Save money by reducing land area needed for stormwater management practices
- Extend the life of a roof by reducing wear and tear caused by temperature related expansion and contraction and protects the roof from ultraviolet (UV) radiation

- % ratio hardscape/softscape is too high


