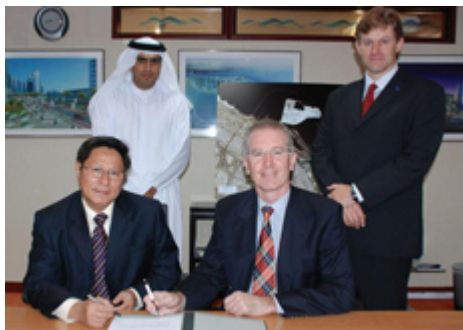


EIMA signs Lloyds Register partnership
